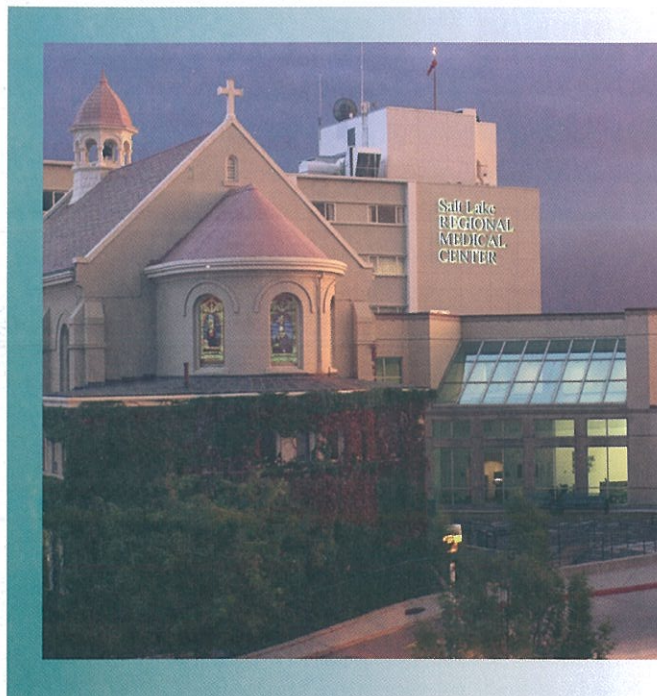


Our Clinical Team

Salt Lake Regional Rehabilitation is supported by Salt Lake Regional Medical Center's many in-house resources. In addition, our team includes:

- A physiatrist—a physician who specializes in physical medicine and rehabilitation.
- Physical therapists who specialize in helping with specialty training for orthopedic and neurologic conditions to help patients regain strength, flexibility, mobility, balance and endurance.
- Occupational therapists who specialize in helping patients return to basic self-care skills and addressing deficits in vision sensation.
- A speech and language pathologist who specializes in improving communication and cognitive skills in expression, comprehension and writing skills. They also assist in the diagnosis and treatment of swallowing disorders.
- A clinical social worker
- Rehabilitation nurses
- Registered dietitians



Our Facility

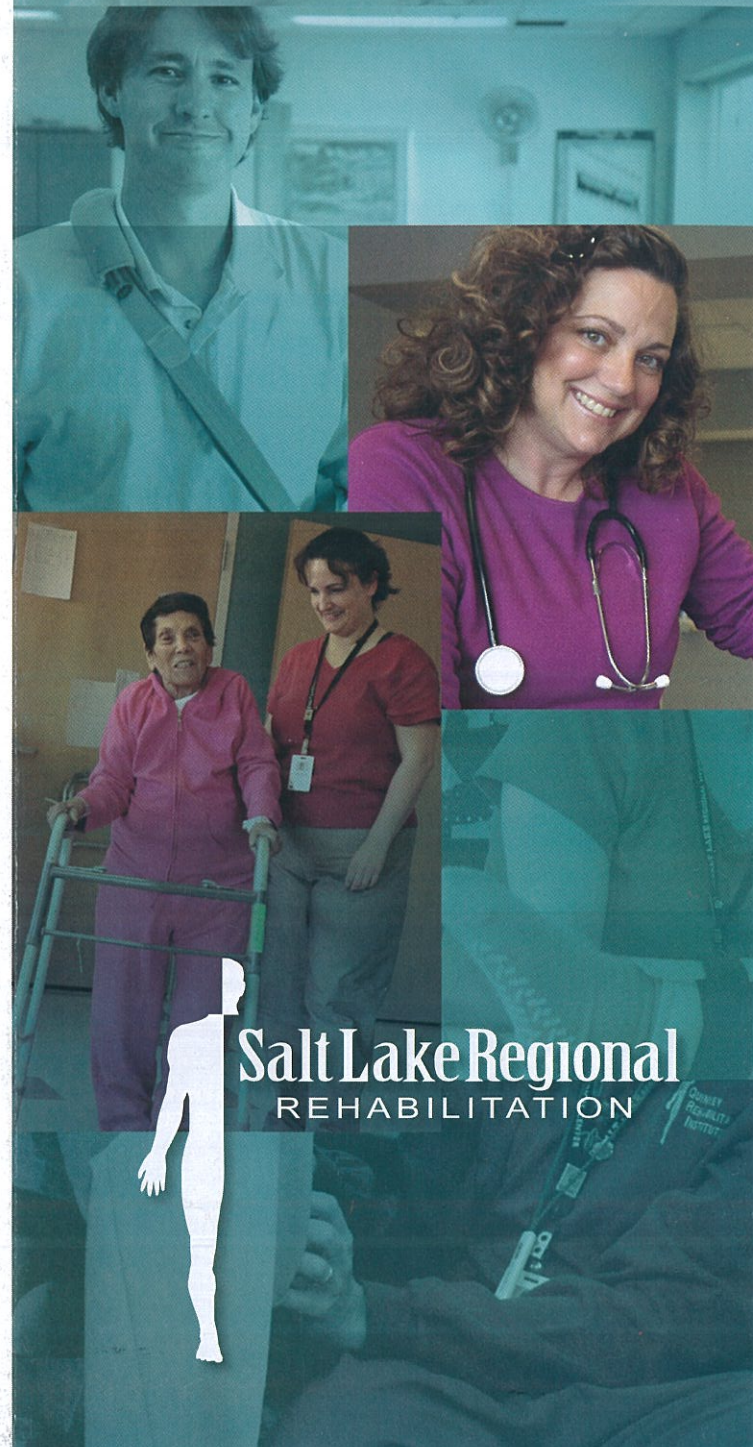

Our Strengths Help Build Your Strength

Our mission at Salt Lake Regional Medical Center Rehabilitation is to help our patients gain the highest level of function after a disabling injury or illness occurs in a supportive and “home-like” environment. We believe strongly in the following when it comes to treatment:

- Smaller is better; our small unit creates a positive working environment and a personalized approach with one-on-one attention to patient needs.
- An individualized treatment plan developed by the patient, physician and clinical treatment team greatly enhances the treatment process.
- Family and patient education should always be used to build a bridge from hospital to home.



Admission Process

Patients can be admitted from hospitals, physician offices, assisted living facilities, skilled nursing facilities or from home. Prior to admission a pre-assessment evaluation will be obtained and reviewed by the clinical team. This is provided free



of charge and in most cases within four hours of referral. Eligibility for admission will be reviewed on an individual basis and must meet the following criteria:

- Requires daily physician visits to oversee the patient's medical needs and functional care plan.
- Needs at least two forms of therapy.
- Must be able to tolerate three hours of therapy over the course of the day, or the potential to build up to that in a short period of time. Adequate rest periods are provided.

What to Bring with you

Patients being admitted will want several changes of comfortable loose fitting clothing (such as T-shirts, sweatpants or shorts), your own personal sleepwear, under clothing and a well fitting pair of shoes or sneakers.

- You may want personal hygiene items or photos from home. Please do not bring items of value!
- In order for us to follow your home medication regimen, please bring with you a list of current medication and /or prescription bottles.



Who Can Benefit

Common admitting diagnoses are:

- Polyarthritis (including Rheumatoid Arthritis)
- Major multiple trauma
- Brain injury
- Amputation
- Spinal Cord injury
- Orthopedic dysfunction
- Degenerative neurological disorders such as:
 - Stroke (CVA)
 - Multiple Sclerosis (MS)
 - Polyneuropathy
 - Muscular Dystrophy
 - Parkinson's Disease
 - Guillain Barre'
- Medical debility

Other patients who require two or more types of therapies will be considered following an assessment of their rehabilitation potential.
